THE 32ND ANNUAL CHICAGO RITA HAYWORTH GALA

ORE THAN 600 GUESTS CELEBRATED at the 32nd annual Alzheimer's Association's Chicago Rita Hayworth Gala underwritten by Rolex on Saturday, May 4, 2019 at the Hilton Chicago. Attendees enjoyed a magical evening and raised more than \$1 million for the critical work of the Alzheimer's Association's research, care, and support programs. This year's theme, "The Key to Our Future", was inspired by Paris' world-famous Pont des Arts (the Love Lock Bridge) and brought together supporters passionate about unlocking a world without Alzheimer's disease.

Longtime Alzheimer's Association supporters, Joan and Paul Rubschlager, were honored with the "Legacy Award" for their longtime efforts of supporting the charity. Jay Allen, country music singer known for his hit

song "Blank Stares", was honored with the "Caregiver Award" alongside his father and sisters, who lost their mother to the disease earlier this year.

The gala, which stands as one of the Alzheimer's Association's marquee fundraising events of the year, was led by Barrington co-chairs and avid supporters, the Murphy family: Dan J. Murphy Jr., JoAnn Murphy, Dan Murphy III, and Jim Murphy. The Murphy family shares a personal connection to the disease as Dan Jr's mother passed away from Alzheimer's in 2011. Dan Murphy Jr. is the president and COO for Idealease, a truck leasing company based in Barrington, as well as a co-owner of Wynstone Golf Club in North Barrington with his wife, JoAnn, and his sons. Dan Murphy III is vice president of Financial Advisory Services at BMO Harris Bank in Chicago and Jim Murphy is an assistant state attorney for the Cook County State's Attorney's Office.
