



Jeffrey Pride Celebrates 20 Years with Gala Fundraiser

The JPF mission is to support the most promising research available until cancer- free lives for children is a reality.

THE JEFFREY PRIDE FOUNDATION for Pediatric Cancer Research is an all-volunteer charity founded in 2000 in memory of Jeffrey Pride, and in response to learning that pediatric cancer research is severely underfunded, receiving less than 4% of all money raised to fight cancer. Over the past 15 years we've supported drug research, clinical trials and most recently genomic testing of children's cancer cells. This provides children with the most promising, targeted and specific treatments for their cancers. These new developments quite possibly could have changed Jeff's treatment and he and other children like him might have been healthy adults today. We have helped cover the actual financial costs for kids going through clinical trials, covering their administrative expenses, those not covered by their insurance. Utilizing the valuable information gained from that study we continued genetic testing looking at markers that help determine each child's genetic risk level, allowing very specific targeted treatments to be developed that attack only the cancer cells and leave the rest of the body unharmed.

A Fifth Season – Hope Shines On Batten Disease

\$225,000 RAISED TO SHINE HOPE ON CHILDREN LIVING WITH BATTEN DISEASE.

THE NOAH'S Hope-Hope 4 Bridget Foundation hosted their 9th annual Batten disease fundraiser on Saturday, November 9, 2019 at the Marriott Oak Brook.

A gracious thank you to our sponsors and 360 guests for making *A Fifth Season* another successful fundraiser! A total of \$225,000 was raised, which will go to support advocacy, and research to develop therapies to delay symptoms of CLN2 Batten disease through the Noah's Hope-Hope 4 Bridget Foundation.

We have devastatingly lost Noah and Laine VanHoutan (Downers Grove), Bridget Kennicott (Barrington), Ethan Gahlbeck (Elmhurst) all between the young ages of 10-12 to Batten disease. Currently, there is no cure for this fatal childhood disease. *Hope shines on for them.*

CLN2 Batten disease is rare genetic disease that is often referred to as the ALS and dementia for children. Children with Batten disease develop normally as toddlers; walking, talking, and laughing. Unfortunately, they soon experienced on-going seizures and loss of muscle control including their ability to speak, walk, and eat.

The evening included keynote speaker, Nicole Boice, Founder of Global Genes, which is a leading patient advocacy organization dedicated to raising global awareness of rare disease. Boice spoke of the impact Noah's Hope-Hope 4 Bridget has had in the Batten and rare disease communities and how their leadership has guided so many with research guidance, policy advocacy and compassion support to families walking the same path.

For the 8th year, Ben Bradley of WGN and Mike Schimmel motivated guests during the live auction and fund-the-need campaign raising over \$50,000 and completed the evening with their annual "AFS selfie",

Sara and David Kennicott and Jennifer and Tracy VanHoutan, founders of Noah's Hope-Hope 4 Bridget, thanked sponsors, welcomed guests, provided a foundation research update unveiled a new foundation video. Guests strolled through the ballroom filled with photos of Noah, Bridget, Ethan and Laine.

The 10th A Fifth Season is planned for Saturday, November 14, 2020.

All funds raised will go towards CLN2 Batten research via Noah's Hope-Hope 4 Bridget, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization whose mission is to provide funding for research and education in efforts to find a treatment and cure for CLN2 Batten disease. 
