BBRC Welcomes Rotary's International President and International Director

On September 28, 2017, the Barrington Breakfast Rotary Club (BBRC) welcomed its International President, Ian Riseley, and International Director, Jorge Aufranc, to its morning meeting. Aufranc praised the club's members for their good work in Guatemala where he said the holistic approach to helping children there is working, and the efforts are making a significant difference. The BBRC International committee worked closely with the Rotary Club of Guatemala Sur since 2011 on multiple global grants featuring the "mechanical cow".

Guatemala has the highest malnutrition index of 54 percent in children younger than 5 years old, and is the country with the highest chronic malnutrition index in Latin America and the Caribbean. The malnutrition in children increases the risk of decreased cognitive development and slows down the overall growth. This is a serious problem, mainly in rural areas. Guatemalan children are lactoseintolerant therefore and cannot digest cow's milk. The mechanical cow is a machine that produces a soy-based "milk" to bring protein and nutrition to Guatemala's children.






