CAROLINE KENNEDY SHARES LEADERSHIP JOURNEY AND FAMILY'S LEGACY OF SERVICE AT JUDSON UNIVERSITY'S World Leaders Forum.

ORMER U.S. AMBASSADOR TO JAPAN CAROLINE KEN-NEDY shared insights into political courage, service, and her family's legacy as keynote speaker for Judson University's eighth World Leaders Forum. The interview, part of an acclaimed series of conversations hosted by bestselling author and nationally syndicated radio host Eric Metaxas, drew more than 500 attendees to the event in Schaumburg.

The interview was recorded as part of Socrates in the City, a conversation series hosted by Metaxas featuring notable thinkers. During the interview, Kennedy discussed topics such as leadership, faith, family, role models, what America means to her, women's empowerment, what it means to be an Ambassador, and being the only surviving child of John F. Kennedy.

"When I was the Ambassador to Japan, Americans often approached me and recited my father's presidential inaugural address from 1961," said Kennedy. "This always made me proud because the quote-ask what you can do for your country-is emblematic of the service and generosity that makes America special."
