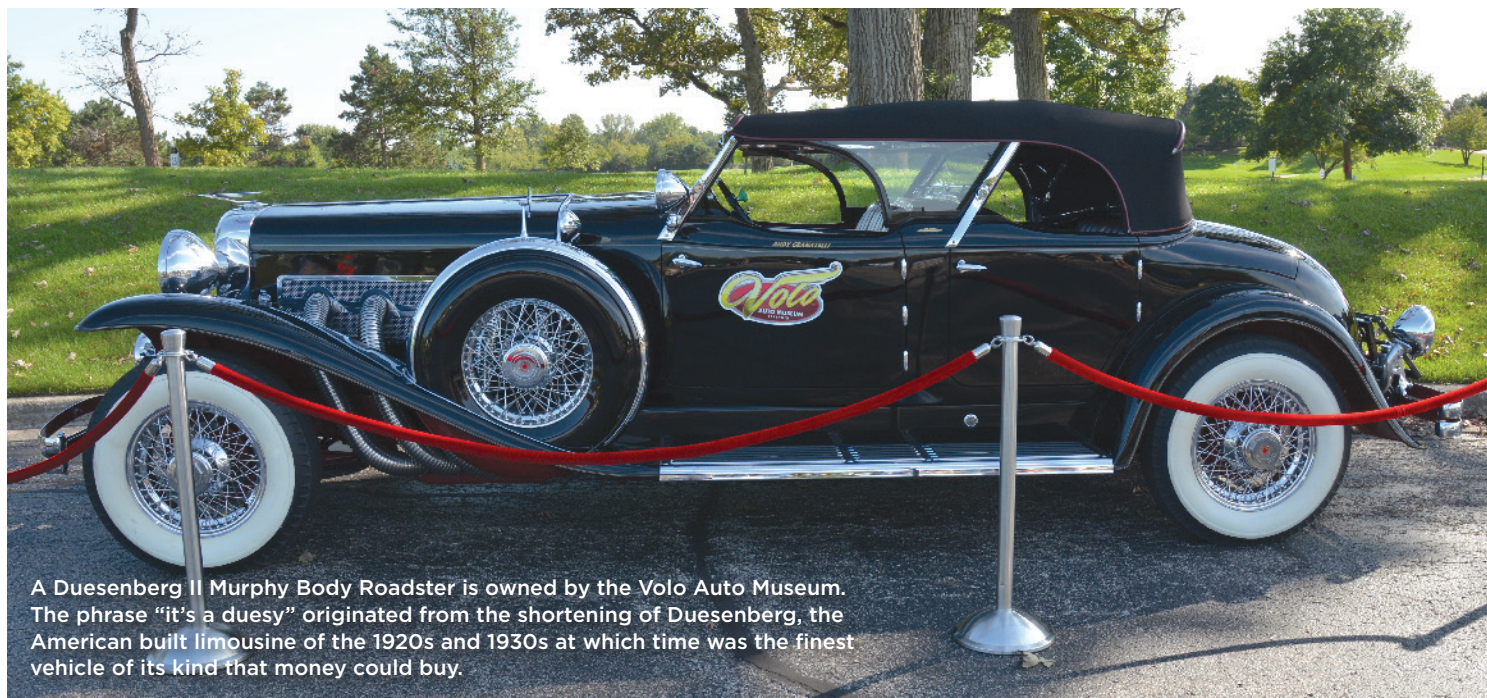


PURPOSE & Party
