For the past 21 years, Boys and Girls Clubs of Dundee Township (BGCDT) has provided kids and teens with research-based programs that focus

on education, healthy lifestyles, and character and leadership development. Today, the club serves 3,000 children at eight schools, including Sunny Hill Elementary, a Barrington 220 school in Carpentersville.

The Boys and Girls Clubs serve children who have significant challenges at home and in their neighborhoods. These children are provided with handson educational and experiential enrichment every day after school, as well as all-day programming during the summer in a safe setting with experienced staff. The club is a place where youth can participate in both supervised and self-directed activities designed to give them the developmental assets necessary to become successful adults. Homework help, leadership opportunities, STEM programming, and a plethora of age-appropriate activities are offered at the club every day. The youth development strategy is to instill a sense of competence, usefulness, belonging, and influence in the young people served.

"Wickstrom Auto is serious about making our community a better place to work and live," Farley said. "Wickstrom has been a great partner of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Dundee Township for several years. We are grateful for everything they do. They help us serve over 3,000 in-need, at-risk children in Carpentersville. Our Teen Career Day at Wickstrom Auto provided our teens with an opportunity to see, first-hand, jobs that might be available to them right out of high school. Our teens are learning the future will be bright for them even if they are not college bound. It was a great day for our club."

Most of the teens in the club will not go to college, so a focus is to educate them on career opportunities that exist for people without a college degree. BGCDT is helping its teens create a life plan about what they will do upon graduating from high school—with the hope that it will define a long-term career that includes health insurance and other benefits with a great company.

BGCDT helps children from kindergarten through high school. Its mission is to nourish character and inspire potential. BGCDT has teamed up with companies to assist its teens with career development.
