





YOUNG HEARTS FOR LIFE (YH4L) is an effort inspired by the death of former Barrington High School athlete David Bow. David died suddenly on his couch in 2002. David was an athlete at UW-Madison. YH4L started at BHS a few years after David's death due by a B220 employee (now retired), Debbie Villars. Young Hearts for Life has been held at Barrington High School in 2017, 2014, 2012, and several years prior to this.
