Pre-orders are encouraged for specific plants.

The In-Person sale will be held May 3–4 from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. at the CFC Plant Sale Barn at CFC's Hill 'N Dale Preserve at Lake-Cook and Ridge Road in Barrington Hills. CFC members will also be able to shop the sale on May 2, and members get a 10 percent discount all days.

CFC's sale is one of the largest in the area, offering more than 200 varieties of native plants. For CFC's Native Plants Database visit (https://nativeplants.citizensforconservation. org/) – a useful resource for ordering and garden planning. Users can sort by water need, sun, color, and desired wildlife species that they hope to attract. At the In-Person sale, native plant experts will be on hand at the sale to answer questions and help buyers find the right species based on their planting site.
