

Dr. Kiran Frey Receives National Recognition

THIS YEAR, Barrington resident Dr. Kiran Frey received the "A Points of Light Award" from the Points of Light Foundation and the Corporation for National and Community Service established by President George W. Bush. This award recognizes individuals for their voluntary service and celebrates the impact volunteers have on communities around the world.

In 1999, Dr. Kiran Frey supported her son Rishi Sethi (who was then 8 years old) to create the Barrington chess program that was inherited by Grandmaster Yury Shulman in 2007. The foundation of the program was inspired by Rishi Sethi from Barrington resident Sam Oliver's leadership in the community. She is a past recipient of the Points of Light Award.

The program combines chess education with service and philanthropy. It has brought chess education to thousands of children who excelled having tied for 1st place twice at Illinois state tournaments, taken 6th place at nationals and won many local awards. Youth Volunteers in the program have won Presidential Service Awards for their humanitarian projects. Chess Without Borders has raised over \$221,000 for local and global charities. Dr Kiran Frey has led the volunteer program since its inception in 1999.







National Wreaths Across America Day was begun to remember the fallen, honor their service, and teach children the cost of freedom.

A brief memorial service will be held on Saturday, December 16, 2023, at Evergreen Cemetery, 610 South Dundee Avenue in Barrington, beginning at noon. Afterward, attendee volunteers will be guided to place wreaths on those graves identified as Veterans, ranging from the Civil War to present day service. The event will be held rain, snow, or shine, until all Veterans have been honored.
