Remembering KAREN SELMAN

HER TIRELESS ADVOCACY FOR COMMUNITY AND FAMILIES LEAVES A REMARKABLE LEGACY

AREN SUE CARTER SELMAN was born in Indianapolis on May 10, 1942, daughter of Marcus and Muriel Carter. She peacefully passed away on December 20, 2023, surrounded by her family. Karen grew up in Greencastle, Indiana and graduated from DePauw University with a degree in speech and drama in 1964. She married and moved to Arlington Heights the same year. Karen taught English and directed student drama productions at William Fremd High School in Palatine for two years until the birth of her first child, Jennifer, in 1967. Her second child, Michael, was born in 1969.

A significant part of Karen's career was spent in early childhood education beginning at the Palatine Township. She became director of the program when it was incorporated into Children's Home and Aid Society (CHASI) in 1983.

Karen lived in Barrington Hills for more than 25 years. A devotee of the equestrian way of life and preserving the uniqueness of Barrington Hills, Karen served as president of the Barrington Hills Riding Club for four years, was elected to the Village of Barrington Hills Board of Trustees for four years (2011-2015) and was founder of the Kalaway Cup—Barrington Hills' annual polo event that supports and highlights all local equestrian-related clubs and associations, for which she served as chairperson for 10 years. She was a staunch defender of the village's open spaces, and minimum 5-acre zoning whenever challenged by high-density residential developers.

Her kindness and genuine interest in others, combined with strong opinions and a mighty sense of humor, attracted a wide range of friends. She was loyal, fearless, and loved by many.

Gov. Pritzker Signs SB1, Creating the Department of Early Childhood

On June 25, 2024, Governor JB Pritzker joined elected officials, early childhood advocates, and education leaders to sign Senate Bill 0001 into law, officially establishing Illinois' new Department of Early Childhood. The new state agency, first proposed by Governor Pritzker in October 2023, will focus exclusively on early childhood programs and services for young children, improving equity and accessibility for families and caregivers. "Our state-funded early childhood programs operate across three different state agencies, putting an unnecessary burden on those families looking for support and on those providing the support that's needed," said Governor JB Pritzker. "I am very proud to usher in the beginning of a new era for early childhood education and care in Illinois as we create the Department of Early Childhood. Once fully implemented in 2026, this new agency will make life simpler, better, and fairer for tens of thousands of Illinois families."
